RESOLUTION NO. 10-08 **Weight Restrictions of Various Axled Vehicles** **on County Roads and Highways**

WHEREAS, Chapter 15-316 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, enacted by the people of the State of Illinois, effective July 1, 1970, provides that the local authorities with respect to highways under their jurisdiction may, by ordinance or resolution, prohibit the operation of vehicles upon any such highway or impose restriction as to the weight of vehicles to be operated upon any such highway, for a total period of not to exceed ninety (90) days in any one calendar year, whenever any said highways, by reason of deterioration, rain, snow, or other climatic conditions will be seriously damaged or destroyed unless the use of vehicles thereon is prohibited or the permissible weights thereof reduced, and,

WHEREAS, the local authority enacting any such ordinance or resolution shall erect or cause to be erected and maintained signs designating the provision of the ordinance or resolution at each end of that portion of any highway affected thereby and the ordinance or resolution shall not be effective unless and until such signs are erected and maintained.

THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED** by the County Board of Boone County, Illinois, in regular meeting convened, that by reason of deterioration, rain, snow, freezing and other climatic conditions, the following highways under the control, supervision and jurisdiction of the County of Boone may be damaged or destroyed if maximum weight limitations upon vehicles traveling on said highways are not established.

With respect to said roads, the maximum weight permitted to be transmitted to the surface of any such highway by any vehicle shall conform to the following limitations:


2 AXLES, SINGLE REAR TIRES (4 TIRES)	7,000 Lbs.
2 AXLES, DUAL REAR TIRES (6 TIRES)	18,000 Lbs.
3 OR MORE AXLES, DUAL REAR TIRES	30,000 Lbs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its adoption, however, will not be in force until the County Engineer posts the notice of the above prohibitions and restrictions at each end of each highway so restricted; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the restrictions and prohibitions while in force shall not exceed ninety (90) days in any calendar year; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be enforced under the provisions set forth by the State of Illinois.

**SPRING WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS
BOONE COUNTY**

The following county highways under the jurisdiction of the Boone County Board involve spring or temporary weight restrictions. Maximum gross load limits are as follows:

2 Axles, Single Rear Tires (4 Tires)	7,000 Lbs.
2 Axles, Dual Rear Tires (6 Tires).....	18,000 Lbs.
3 or More Axles, Dual Rear Tires.....	30,000 Lbs.

1. Manchester Road and State Line Road - From Winnebago County Line to Salt Box Road.
2. Hunter Road - From Winnebago County Line to McHenry County Line.
3. Beaverton Road - From Hunter Road to Manchester Road.
4. Poplar Grove Road - From one-half mile north of Illinois Route 173 to Hunter Road.
5. Capron Road - From Angling Road to the South line of the Village of Capron limits and from Illinois 173 to Hunter Road (excepting that portion within Capron Village limits).
6. Caledonia Road - From Illinois Route 76 to Hunter Road.
7. Russellville, Grange Hall & Angling Roads - From Woodstock Road to McHenry County Line.
8. Garden Prairie Road - From School Street in the Village of Garden Prairie to Woodstock Road.
9. Stone Quarry Road - From DeKalb County Line to Chrysler Drive.
10. Cherry Valley Road - From DeKalb County Line to Winnebago County Line.
11. Kirkland Road - From DeKalb County Line to Cherry Valley Road.

NOTE: Poplar Grove Road from the city limits of Belvidere to the village limits of Poplar Grove, Genoa Road from the DeKalb County Line to Business Route 20, Woodstock Road from Poplar Grove Road to McHenry County Line, Crawford/Garden Prairie Road from McHenry County Line to School Street and Logan Avenue from Belvidere Road to U. S. 20 will only require weight restrictions under extreme conditions. These roads will be legal load limit roads during the posting period, no overweight permits allowed with the exception of Genoa Road between the Illinois Tollway Ramp and U. S. Route 20 where 80,000 pound loads will be allowed as specified in the Illinois Compiled Statutes.
